Acquisition and Development (A&D) Committee December, 2020

The Issue

An update on the progress towards the application for funding development of the 24 Acres via the Prop 68 grant

Background

With the extension of the Prop 68 Statewide Park Program (SPP) grant deadline from December 14th, 2020 to March 12th, 2021 staff made the decision to keep the public input survey link live until December 11th. The survey link is featured on the ARD home web page and Facebook page and the master plan outreach process was featured on the front page of the Auburn Journal 11/25 edition. Outreach and public input is typically only required within a one-mile radius of a project but with the exposure provided by the Journal article, citizens throughout the region were alerted to the process and have an opportunity to take the survey. Four residents requested hard-copies of the survey as they were without internet access and the on-line survey has received over 200 responses

CEQA process for the 24 Acres Site is underway and includes tasks such as; reviewing previous documentation and technical studies, biological resources survey and wetland delineation, arborist report, cultural resources records search and others.


Staff has also made progress on getting a trail easement on the Timberline property, directly south of the 24 Acres. As the attached Timberline Vesting Tentative Map shows, a multi-purpose trail easement already exists. This will help ARD in its efforts to get the best possible point total on the SPP grant.

List of future trails

This list is provided to share locations and information about trails that could be added/built on ARD owned or managed properties. The ability to create these trails will depend on budgetary and staffing resources.

In no particular order:


- Regional Park 24 Acres: a series of trails already exist on the property. These trails are currently not maintained, except for basic mowing right before the annual obstacle course race. In the absence of development of the 24 Acres, it would be possible to create a basic map of these trails with approximate distances. Signs could be added to direct users on the trails. The cost to do this would be approximately \$2,500, which includes a GPS survey to mark the trail points on a map and related signage. Maintenance of these trails would be very basic due to a lack of staff resources. With the budget revision passed, staff has set aside \$10,000 toward this effort. A conceptual site plan as well as a map of existing trails is attached. Staff has also met with Guliani & Kull's Survey Technician out at the site to clarify what existing trails the District wants delineated on a map that can be used as the basis for trail map signage and brochures.
- Regional Park Rock Creek area: this area has been discussed previously as a place to add a trail that would run adjacent to Rock Creek. An example of the route this nice addition to Regional Park could take is seen below.

The cost to build this trail is unknown. Potential costs to build such a trail would include CEQA review, permits (CA F&W, Placer County, Army Corp), foot-bridges (1 – 3 needed depending on route), surveying, brush removal and trail creation. Maintenance of this trail would be a challenge at current staffing levels.




• Shockley Property: trails on the Shockley Property have been discussed several times. The expansive 26 acres would allow for a series of new trails that could be added to the existing trails on the property.

Current costs to create new trails at the Shockley Property are unknown. Potential costs to build these trails would include CEQA review, permits (Placer County), surveying, brush removal and trail creation. Maintenance of this trail would be a challenge at current staffing levels.
